Thank you for your continued support! This half term, we have really enjoyed learning about The heart and crime and punishment.

Here is an outline of the curriculum coverage for Spring 2.

This half term, our topics are Violent Volcanoes & Evolution and Inheritance. We will be focussing our learning around the key questions: Volcanoes: What are they? and What is the Theory of Evolution?

Our 'Stunning Start' to launch our topic will be:

The children will be immersing themselves in an audio experience using Now Press Play, exploring volcanoes and earthquakes and their effects on society.

Our 'Showstopper' piece of work at the end of the topic will be:

Children will make a model volcano. They will film the eruption and create an explanation text explaining how volcanoes erupt. We will enhance children's learning and 'Cultural Capital' with the following virtual experiences, websites and texts:
