Dear Families,

Welcome back to Pinner Wood and welcome to Year 2. Teaching in Year 2 this year are Miss Thomas, Ms Stephenson and Mrs Hickman supported by Miss Randell, Mrs Bhimani and Miss Campbell. We are really looking forward to this year because of all the exciting topics and we know the children are so keen to learn! Our talented team will ensure that all learning needs and levels are catered for and everyone has an exciting and productive term back at school.

This half term, our topic is History: **'The Great Fire of London'** and we will be focusing our learning around the key question: ***What have we learnt from past mistakes?***

Our 'Stunning Start' to launch our topic will be:

We will be travelling back in time and our classrooms will be transformed into Pudding Lane Bakery. Children will study artefacts and dress up as bakers.

We will enhance children's learning and 'Cultural Capital' with the following virtual experiences, websites and texts:

- A virtual tour of Pudding Lane and The Monument using Google Earth.
- Looking at artefacts from the GFoL using The Museum of London website

Our Showcase at the end of the topic will be:

Making our own houses and creating our own Great Fire of London including a voice over to explain how the fire spread.

Our 'Shared Outcome' to communicate our learning with others:

Sharing our video with another year group.

Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

English:

The children will begin by writing the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We will be discussing adjectives, verbs, adverbs and interesting sentence openers. There will be a focus on accurate punctuation such as capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. We will then focus our writing around the book 'The Wolf's Story' and will write character descriptions and recounts.

Maths:

We will be focusing on place value with an emphasis on partitioning numbers into tens and ones. We will also be writing and reading numbers in numerals and words. We will recap counting in 2s, 5s and 10s before moving onto addition and subtraction. The children will learn the bonds to 100 (in 10s) before adding and subtracting 1 more, 1 less, 10 more, 10 less and 2 digit and 1 digit numbers crossing the 10s barrier.

Science:

Our topic this half term is called 'Taking Care' and we will focus on how to eat well, look after yourself by having good hygiene and exercising. We will conduct an experiment to see what happens to our body when we exercise.

Usborne Young readers: The Great Fire of London

Take a trip to visit Pudding Lane by Monument in London to see where in the fire started.

History: Our topic is the 'Great Fire of London.' We will learn about how it started, what happened and the importance of Samuel Pepys. We also will learn how the Great Fire of London changed London into the place it is today.

RE: We will have an RE day and take part in a variety of activities to answer the question: 'What makes a home? We will focus on Jainism and Hinduism.

Art: The children will learn about how artists like Paul Klee and Lowry use shapes and lines to create different effects. They will then experiment with creating patterns and will create their own imagination homes in a final piece of art.

PE: We will be working on dancing, learning about how to create a character, express emotion using motifs and working in partners. In outdoor PE will be learning about effective jumping techniques and using these in games.

Music: Children will learn the fundamentals of music. We will begin with a unit called 'Hands, Heart and Feet'.

PSHE: We will begin with the unit 'Hopes and Fears for the Year'. Classes will revisit our Pinner Wood Values and what they look like in Year 2.

Computing: We will be creating presentations using the app Thinglink.
