This half term, our topic is **The Night Sky** and we will be focussing our learning around the key question: **What can you see in the night sky?**

Our 'Stunning Start' to launch our topic will be:

Darkness Day

The children will be exploring the scientific concept of 'light' and 'dark'.

The will be taking part in different activities relating to the dark and using their 5 senses.

We will enhance children's learning and 'Cultural Capital' with the following experiences;

- Now Press Play interactive story-Space
- Space day dressing up as aliens or astronauts
- Perform drama workshop relating to Space

Our 'Showcase' piece of work at the end of the topic will be:

Christmas performance

The children will be learning

Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

Literacy:

Key texts:

- The Best Diwali Ever
- Meet the Planets
- -Non fiction books about Space

Key skills:

- Engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary.
- Using some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.
- Write some or all of their name

Maths:

Key topics:

- Introducing the numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 using practical resources, such as Numicon.
- One more and One less
- Circles and Triangles
- Shapes with 4 sides.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

Staff will encourage children to share, take turns and play happily together. Over the term, children will learn how to develop their independence in selecting activities and using equipment appropriately.

Understanding of the World

Children will find out about different Autumn festivals like Diwali and will develop awareness of the environment through colour and the changing seasons.

Physical Development

The children will discuss how our bodies change after exercise. In PE lessons children will learn to stop and start and respond to instructions. They will have the chance to practise fine motor skills and use writing and drawing tools and equipment carefully.
