

It was great to welcome the children back in September, with school trips and clubs slowly being reintroduced. We all hope this more normal school life is able to continue safely.

Heartfelt thanks from all of us on the Governing Body go to teachers and staff for their resilience and determination to ensure all children catch up with their learning journey. We are very proud of their enthusiasm and drive to make Pinner Wood such a great place to learn. All have embodied our school values of Stepping Up and Strength through Positivity.

Our thanks also go to Friends of Pinner Wood for their tireless fundraising on behalf of the pupils. This year, the money raised will be put towards new playground equipment for Year 5 and 6 children. On their behalf, thank you to all who contributed for your generosity.

With the Autumn term drawing to a close, we wanted to celebrate the achievements of the past three months, and the progress made against our strategic objectives, in spite of the on-going challenges of the pandemic:

- Our greatest priority is always the pupils, we are delighted to see the progress made across the school. Our strategies to ensure "no child misses out" are in place and showing positive results.
- We set out to develop the use of technology within the school and invested significantly in this area. Since September, there are now 15 iPads available per class, which gives pupils the opportunity to learn and practice skills fundamental to navigate the world they live in.

- Pinner Wood received the Harrow Go Green award for its positive contribution to the community and environment. Thank you to all involved in designing, creating and maintaining the meadow and garden areas, including the families who took part in the Gardening Club.

The last few months have brought changes to the Governing Body as well. We said goodbye to Carolyn Hector and to Josh Berle: thank you both for all your time, contributions and commitment. We warmly welcome Georgiana Lisk (co-opted governor), Tuli Palit and Rinku Harjani (parent governors) and congratulate Emma Kelly for being re-elected. Thank you to all who participated in the recent parent governor election – we are lucky to have a dedicated community willing to put themselves forward.
