Shabbat begins at sunset on Friday and lasts until Saturday evening. Shabbat is the day of rest for Jewish people. Jewish people believe that God created the Earth in 6 days and then on the 7th day he rested. The day of rest was Saturday, Shabbat. Jews celebrate with prays, candles and Challah bread. Sunday is a special day for Christians this is known as the Sabbath. Christians celebrate with pray. 	

Our Curriculum Journey	Journey: The children will recap on what they know and have learned previously about Christianity and Judaism. They will then focus on the important days in these religion, Shabbat - Saturday for Jews, Sabbath - Sunday for Christians. They will look at what people do on these days, what they eat, where they go and why they are important. Finally the children will think about why it is important for Christians and Jews to have a day that is different to other days and then will think about what day is important to themselves and why.
