Fundamentals						Key Facts/Sticky Knowledge	The Torah is the holy text of the Jewish people. The word "Torah" in Hebrew means 'to guide'. The Torah is like a scroll. It is kept in a silver case when it is not being read. It is written in Hebrew The Sabbath or Shabbat (the Hebrew word for 'Sabbath') is the seventh day of the week. The Sabbath begins at sunset on Friday and lasts until nightfall on Saturday. During Shabbat Jewish families will often visit the Synagogue. Special prayers are said and parts of the Torah are read out.
