Mihrab - ornamental, semi-circular indentation in the wall of the prayer room of a mosque that indicates the direction of Mecca. Minbar - a raised area at the front of the prayer hall where the sermons or speeches take place. Minaret - where the muezzin calls the faithful to prayer five times a day Muezzin - the person responsible to call Muslims to prayer. Prayer Hall - the place where Muslims sit or kneel to pray. Muslims always pray facing Mecca. Jummah - Friday prayers.				
Our Curriculum Journey	Journey: The children start by thinking about the different places of worship in the major religions - comparing them an looking for differences and similarities. They then take a virtual tour around a Mosque in Birmingham and learn about the parts of a Mosque which are unique to Islam, and why they are important. The children learn about the different uses for a Mosque other than simply worship. They finish by gathering in groups of 5 or 6 and giving a presentation on the information they have learned.
