Our Curriculum Journey	Journey: Children first explore the key concepts of Sikhism and looked closely at the 10 gurus. They will look at what <i>Guru</i> means teacher/master and understand how all the <i>Gurus</i> built on the Sikh religion focusing on different key teachings. The 1st <i>Guru</i> (<i>Guru Nanak</i>) up to the 10th <i>guru</i> (<i>Guru Gobind Singh</i>) all played a part in the values instilled in Sikhs today. They will then explore the many teachings he preached and debated which we felt were the most important. Then, they will link these to real life scenarios giving advice to children's problems using his values as a basis for our response. Linking to our key question they will explore how the final <i>Guru's</i> teachings were inspired by the original <i>Guru</i> .
