Our Curriculum Journey	<p>Journey: Children will understand how websites use advertisements to promote products.</p> <p>D - Design: Pupils start to discuss the desired outcome for their project and are given time to tinker with seesaw before planning what they will do to achieve their outcome. They will design their own project based on their class reader, Ottoline and the Yellow Cat.</p> <p>A - Apply: Pupils are given the opportunity to create, make and produce their story graph based on the most exciting parts of the book. The children are then given time to create their story maps/graphs.</p> <p>R - Refine: Pupils spend time considering ways to modify and improve their story graphs.</p> <p>E - Evaluate: Upon completing their desired outcome, pupils are given the opportunity to reflect and consider how effectively they have achieved their goal.</p> <p>S - Share: Learners are given the opportunity to publish and exhibit their work on Seesaw embedding skills from the Digital Literacy curriculum.</p>
