<p>Our Curriculum Journey</p>	<p>Stunning Start: The children will take part in an orienteering-based quiz, collecting letters to spell out the word 'Hemisphere'.</p> <p>Journey: The children will recap their knowledge about the seven continents, then learn about the major countries in Europe. They will then learn about the capital cities - what they purpose of a capital is, and the names of the main capital cities in Europe. The children will take a deep dive into Italy, learning about the physical and human characteristics of the country. Their outcome will be a leaflet, persuading people to visit Italy. The children will then learn about the different physical features within Europe, the differing cuisines within the continent, and then finally the different ways Christmas is celebrated in the different countries.</p> <p>Showcase: The children will create leaflets persuading people to visit Italy.</p>
