<p>Our Curriculum Journey</p>	<p>Journey: The children begin by thinking about how people of all religions pray. They then think about where and why people pray. They will learn that people pray for many reasons including to be closer to God and to ask for forgiveness. Then we will move onto thinking about where Christians pray. The children will learn that Christians can pray anywhere. Moving on, the children will learn that when Christians pray they might be in a Church, wear or hold a symbol of Christianity, sing a religious hymn in the congregation or in a choir amongst other things. Finally the children will learn about the Lord's prayer and what it means.</p>
