Our Curriculum Journey	Journey : We begin the topic by looking at forgiveness and how this links in with Judaism but across all religions and non-religious setting. We then move on to looking at the Jewish New Year (Rosh Hashana) and how Jewish people go through a period of forgiveness and repentance on the lead up to the New Year. They celebrate by cutting and eating apples with honey. The children show this through an Art piece. The children learn about Jonah and the Whale and the importance of being an honest human.
